HOW TO FIND A JOURNAL ARTICLE:

Connect to <u>ATLA Religion Database http://rave.ohiolink.edu/databases/login/reli</u> and follow the onscreen instructions for searching the database. To locate articles about scripture passages, read the instructions for <u>Searching Scripture http://etextb.ohiolink.edu/help/reli-scripture.html</u>.

If the database does not link to the full text, do a Title search in <u>FOCUS http://focus.msj.edu/</u> for the journal title. This will tell you if the Mount Library has the journal, the dates held, and where it is located.

If the article is not available in the Mount Library, you may request a photocopy of the article from another library by completing an Interlibrary Loan Request Form https://zap2.library.colostate.edu/zap/Entry.cgi?Affiliation=cmj .

HOW TO FIND A BOOK:

In <u>FOCUS http://focus.msj.edu/</u>, do a Subject search to locate a book about one of the Gospels. Enter your subject search this way:

- Bible. N. T. Matthew, or
- Bible. N. T. Mark, or
- Bible. N. T. Luke, or
- Bible. N. T. John.

If no items are found, connect to OhioLINK Central Catalog http://olc1.ohiolink.edu/search . To get items from OhioLINK, click on REQUEST THIS ITEM and follow the on-screen instructions.

To get books that are not listed in FOCUS or OhioLINK, complete an <u>Interlibrary Loan Request Form https://zap2.library.colostate.edu/zap/Entry.cgi?Affiliation=cmj</u>.
